Section 3: That the bonds shall be executed for Navapache Hospital District, Navajo and Apache Counties, Arizona, by the Chairman and attested by the Secretary of the Board of Directors of the hospital district, and shall be countersigned by the Chairmen of the Boards of Supervisors of Navajo and Apache Counties, Arizona, one such signatures to be manually executed but either or both of the remaining may be mechanically reproduced on the bonds; that the interest coupons attached to the bonds shall bear the facsimile of the signatures of the officials as they appear upon the bonds, which officials shall, by the execution of the bonds, adopt as and for their proper signatures their facsimile signatures appearing on the bonds, and that the bonds and coupons shall be in substantially the form hereafter to be adopted by this Board.

Section 4: That for the purpose of providing for the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds as they mature, the Board of Directors of the hospital district shall lease the hospital building and its equipment for such term as the Board shall deem reasonable, but for not less than five (5) nor more than ten (10) years to a corporation not for pecuniary profit, duly organized under the laws of the State of Arizona, and that the rental received upon the lease shall be on such term as shall provide a fair return to the district of its investment and shall be sufficient to meet the payment of principal of and interest on any bonds issued under the terms of this resolution, and to yield, in addition thereto, an amount necessary to meet the expenses of the district. The rental, when received, shall be remitted to the County Treasurer of Navajo County, Arizona, to be placed in a special fund to be known as Navapache Hospital District of Navajo and Apache Counties, Arizona, Hospital Revenue Fund, hereby created, and shall be used for no other purpose than to first, pay the expenses of the district, and second, to pay into the Interest and Redemption Fund hereby created, for the payment of the bonds herein authorized to be issued, an amount necessary to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds as such amounts are required. The Board of Directors of the hospital district shall establish and maintain during the entire life of the bonds a reserve fund in an amount equal to the debt service requirements in any two year period during the term of the bonds requiring the greatest amount for debt service, to provide for any deficiency in the amount regularly collected from rentals or tax collection. In the event of a deficiency in any year during the entire life of the bonds in the rental received by the hospital district, so that the rental is insufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds as each becomes due, there shall be levied on all of the taxable property in the hospital district a direct, annual, ad valorem tax sufficient to pay the deficiency in the expenses of the hospital district, including interest on and principal of these bonds. Said Reserve Fund shall be used for no purpose except to pay deficiencies in the Interest and Redemption Fund, and shall, throughout the life of this issue of bonds, be replenished by tax levies and be maintained at its full amount until all bonds of this issue are paid. The tax, when levied, shall be extended and collected in the manner that other taxes are extended and collected, and the officials of the hospital district and of the counties charged with the extension and collection of taxes, without further instructions from the Board of Supervisors, shall extend and collect the tax and shall deposit the proceeds thereof in the aforesaid Interest and Redemption Reserve Fund.

Section 5: That the Chairman and Secretary of the Board of Directors of Navapache Hospital District, Navajo and Apache Counties, Arizona, and the Chairmen of the Boards of Supervisors of Navajo and Apache Counties, Arizona, are hereby authorized to execute in the name of the hospital district the bonds as herein provided; that the bonds be sold to the best bidder for cash but in no event below par; that upon the sale of the bonds, the County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to deliver the bonds to the purchaser thereof upon receipt of payment therefor, in accordance with the provisions of this resolution.

Section 6: That the proceeds from the sale and delivery of the bonds herein authorized shall be set aside and deposited by the County Treasurer of Navajo County in a separate account or accounts, and such proceeds shall be used solely for the purpose of providing funds to carry out the purpose as shown in the foregoing question; that the unexpended balance, if any, remaining after such payments, shall be used for the repurchase of the bonds at a price not to exceed the principal thereof plus accrued interest, or shall be deposited in the Interest and Redemption Fund provided for the issue of bonds above described. Any bonds that may be repurchased shall be immediately cancelled.

RESOLUTION APPROVING AND PROVIDING FOR THE EXECUTION OF A PROPOSED
NEIGHBORHOOD FACILITIES GRANT CONTRACT NO. Ariz. N-7

WHEREAS, under Section 703 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1965, the United States of America (herein called the "Government") has tendered to County of Apache (herein called the "Grantee"), a proposed Neighborhood Facilities Grant Contract under which the Government agrees to make a Grant to the Grantee to aid in financing a project, designated Project No. Ariz. N-7; and

WHEREAS, the Grantee has given due consideration to said proposed Contract; and

WHEREAS, the Grantee is duly authorized, under and pursuant to the Constitution and laws of the State of Arizona, to undertake and carry out said Program and to execute such proposed Contract.

BE IT (RESOLVED) BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF APACHE, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The proposed Contract, designated Neighborhood Facilities Grant Contract No. Ariz. N-7(G), consisting of Parts I and II, under and subject to the provisions, terms, and conditions of which the Government will make a Neighborhood Facilities Grant under Section 703 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1965, to the Grantee to aid in financing the cost of a project, designated Project No. Ariz. N-7, situated in the City of St. Johns, County of Apache, State of Arizona, is hereby in all respects approved.

Section 2. The Chairman is hereby authorized and directed to execute said proposed Contract in two counterparts on behalf of the Grantee, and the Clerk, Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized and directed to impress and attest the official seal of the Grantee on each such counterpart and to forward such counterparts to the Department of Housing and Urban Development, together with such other documents relative to the approval and execution thereof as may be required by the Government.

Section 3. The Clerk, Board of Supervisors of this Grantee is hereby authorized to file requisitions, together with necessary supporting documents, with the Government, from time to time as Grant funds are required, requesting payments to be made to it on account of the Grant provided for in the Contract, and to do and perform all other things and acts required to be done or performed in order to obtain such payments.

Section 4. The Grantee agrees to abide by all of the provisions, terms, and conditions of said Contract.

Section 5. This Resolution shall take effect this seventh day of October, 1968.
